PREFACE

The present Index to the Federal Statutes has been prepared in pursuance of the act of March 3, 1927 (44 Stat. 1401, ch. 375), as amended June 14, 1930 (46 Stat. 585, ch. 487), which provides:

That the Librarian of Congress is hereby authorized and directed to have the index to the Federal Statutes, published in 1908 and known as the Scott and Beaman Index, revised and extended to include the Acts of Congress down to and including the Acts of the Seventieth Congress, and to have the revised index printed at the Government Printing Office.

It was therefore begun as an extension of the "Index Analysis of the Federal Statutes," prepared in 1908 by George W. Scott and Middleton G. Beaman under direction of the Librarian of Congress. But the amount of legislation to be indexed is nearly double that in 1908, necessitating many expedients to keep the present volume from becoming entirely unwieldy. Many of these are purely mechanical devices, such as closer spacing, runover citations, etc.; but further economies have been effected, primarily at the expense of the detailed analysis embodied in the original Index. For example:

Closely related titles have often been combined, avoiding considerable duplication of indexing; e. g., HARBORS, NAVIGABLE WATERS, and RIVERS are now indexed together under NAVIGABLE WATERS.

The number of entries for any one act under the same title has often been considerably limited. Thus, the same or adjacent provisions are seldom cited more than once under the same subdivision; and the amount of subdivision of titles has been reduced; e. g., practically all subdivisions to the fifth place (see pp. 692-699 of the Scott and Beaman Index) have been eliminated, as well as a large number of those to the third or fourth place.

A number of entries have been omitted entirely, or relegated to footnotes, on the ground that the provisions indexed, though of interest in 1908, were not permanent general legislation and hence were outside the normal scope of the Index.

In the table of repeals and amendments, references to temporary or local provisions not cited in the text of the Index have been omitted.

With all the necessary emphasis on conciseness, care has been taken to make the volume as far as possible a practically useful index to the Federal law within its scope. With this in view, there has been in particular a very considerable extension of the use of cross-references. Citations have been given in the body of the Index to the United States Constitution and its amendments. The various tariff schedules have been indexed by subject. Several new headings have been introduced, to include provisions formerly scattered; e. g., EVIDENCE—Prima Facie Evidence (p. 399); GOVERNMENT COMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES (p. 461). A list of statutory definitions is included. Reference is given in the table of repeals and amendments to implied as well as express amendments and repeals. And considerable information contained in the Statutes, but not strictly within the scope of the Index, is given in notes (see, e. g., pp. 262-263, 354-355). In order to bring the revision as nearly as possible up to date, citations have been given to legislation of the Seventy-first Congress, also. It is hoped that this revision may prove of genuine value to those who have occasion to consult the Federal Statutes. Suggestions as to errors and omissions will be gladly received; and inquiries concerning the Index may be directed to the Legislative Reference Service, Library of Congress.

We wish to make acknowledgment of assistance, especially in connection with determining the effect of implied repeals and amendments, from numerous persons connected with the legal staffs of the various Executive Departments and other Government establishments.
