Thank you for contacting me regarding the constitutionality of the federal income tax. I appreciate hearing from you.

As you know, the Sixteenth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution empowers Congress to tax incomes. Specifically, this amendment states "The Congress shall have power to lay and collect taxes on incomes, from whatever source derived, without apportionment among the several States, and without regard to any census or enumeration." The amendment was approved by two-thirds of the House and Senate and ratified by three-fourths of the states in 1913.
