## MOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 5.

A RESOLUTION RATIFYING AN AMENDMENT PROPOSET BY THE SIXTY-FIRST CONCRESS OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, ON THE FIFTEENTH DAY OF MARCH, ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE, TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES AND DESIGNATED AS ARTICLE SIXTEEN.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SHARTE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA.

WHEREAS; the Sixty-first Congress of the United States of Americas at its first session begun and held at the City of Washington, on Monday the fifteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and nine, by joint resolution proposed an amendment to the constitution of the United States, in words and figures as follows to-wit:

"Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America, in Congress assembled two-thirds of each house concurring therein, that the following article is proposed as an amensment to the constitution of the United States, which, when ratified by the Legislatures, of three-fourths of the several states, shall be valid to all intents and purposes as a part of the constitution:-

ARTICLE 16: The Congress shall have power to lay and collect taxes or incomes, from whatever source derived, without apportionment among the several states, and from any census or enumeration.

Now Therefore, Be it Resolved by the House of Representatives and the Senate of the State of Oklahoma in extraordinary session assembled, such subject having been recomended by the Governor for consideration, that said proposed amendment to the constitution of the United States of America is hereby ratified.
